1. **TASK:** The Work includes migrating the existing controls for the POL system at N11 into a new fiberglass hut located next to building N11. The existing controls are currently located outside of building N11 in 5 different exterior panel boards.

A summary of scope items:

1. Provide fiberglass enclosure for new/relocated control, electrical, alarm, and leak detection equipment.

2. Relocate necessary control and other related equipment to new fiberglass enclosure in accessible area adjacent to Building N11.

3. Provide heat detection in existing Building N11 and new control enclosure with alarm signal transmission to central receiving stations.

4. Provide a standalone electrical panel for control panel power, Building N11 and site lighting, fuel separator immersion heaters, fuel separator heat trace, and fiberglass enclosure heating.

5. Existing equipment at current outdoor location will be modified as necessary to accommodate the relocation of these systems to the new equipment enclosure. Some of these enclosures will remain as termination points for new power/control cables.

6. Mount a manual alarm pull station at the exterior of the new enclosure.

7. Relocate generator power inlet to location more accessible by roll up generator and install new power inlet to replace existing. Existing electrical meter and manual transfer switch to remain as is otherwise.

SITE VISIT

A site visit for this project will be held on June 29, 2023, at 9:00 am at Base Kodiak, AK. The contractor shall field verify existing conditions and the number /location /height and mounting configuration of all equipment required or affected by this scope of work. The facility information provided (PDF file) has not been verified to be accurate. The contractor shall inspect the site and determine the performance requirements.

Access equipment (man-lifts, ladders, etc.) will NOT be provided by the Government.

At this site visit the contractor will be required to verify existing conditions to the extent required to complete the work. At this site visit the contractor will be required to verify existing circuitry and source of power. No additional as-built information (beyond that already provided with the SOW) is available.

Offerors shall comply with their parent contract and the proposal instructions below in preparing their proposals. Award of a firm-fixed-price task order without discussions is anticipated.

2. LOCATION/PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE:

a. Location: The work under this contract is located at USCG Base Kodiak, Alaska. Site Visit information is provided under the full text provision FAR 52.236-27.

b. Period of Performance: The Period of Performance is projected at 365 Calendar Days see full text clause FAR 52.211-10.

The Government anticipates award July 20, 2023.

c. Magnitude of Construction: This project is estimated between \$250,000 and \$500,000.

d. Offer Acceptance Period: By submitting an offer the Offeror guarantees their proposed pricing for a **minimum of 60 calendar days** after receipt of offers.

e. Bid Bonds/Offer Guarantee: An offer guarantee/bid bond WILL NOT be required for this task order.

f. Wage Determination: General Decision Number: AK20230001 dated 05/18/2023 applies to this project.

4. **BASE ACCESS**: Awarded Contractor access to Base Kodiak shall be coordinated with the Base Kodiak Facilities Engineering Department.

5. **EVALUATION/BASIS OF AWARD:** Award of a firm fixed price Task Order will be made to the lowest total priced responsive Offeror. It is anticipated that award will be based on the initial proposals. The USCG reserves the right to engage in exchanges with offerors, if necessary.

The Government will follow the procedures described in FAR Part 16.505 Ordering. Each HUBZone awardee of the RMACC will be provided with a fair opportunity to be considered for this task order. The Government will award to the lowest priced offer, which conforms to this task order solicitation. Only price and price related factors will be considered. The Government reserves the right to request a detailed price breakdown or other information as necessary. The total evaluated price is the total of CLINs 0001 as listed on the Price Schedule.

6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

a. Performance and Payment Bonds: Within 10 calendar days of award of a task order, the contractor shall provide good and sufficient surety or sureties acceptable to the Government as required by FAR 52.228-15, Performance and Payment Bonds-Construction (JUN 2020) (DHS Deviation May 2020).

b. Limitations on Subcontracting. In accordance with FAR 52.219-14, task orders are subject to the following subcontracting limitations:

(1) General construction. The concern will perform <u>at least 15 percent</u> of the cost of the contract, not including the cost of materials, with its own employees.

(2) Construction by special trade contractors. The concern will perform at least 25 percent of the cost of the contract, not including the cost of materials, with its own employees.
